

OXBOW FALLS PARK

Oxbow Falls Park, a Madison County Park, consists of 125 acres of land. The park is open to the public year-round from dawn to dusk, and provides opportunities for hiking, picnicking, ball games, and other forms of outdoor recreation.

Three waterfalls are located at the park. Water drops approximately 100 feet from the upper falls. Clockwise Creek, the headwaters of the park, flows into the lower falls. The lower falls are located in the Town of Farnham.

The sharp change in elevation shown for several miles eastward across the Oxbow Lake Plain, and on to Lake Ontario. Limestone outcroppings in the upper portion of the park are the northernmost edge of the Helderberg Escarpment, which formed during the Devonian Period 400 to 350 million years ago.
